SNOWY STREETS

New Glenwood Park has a contract with a local company to plow and clear our streets when there are 3 inches or more of fallen snow. PLEASE TRY TO HAVE YOUR VEHICLES OFF THE STREETS WHEN SNOW IS FORECAST It is much easier to plow the streets when there are no obstacles and it is less likely that your vehicle will be blocked by plowed snow. There are also salt barrels located at different locations in the neighborhood. You will need your own shovel or scoop. Please use accordingly for intersections or street corners that are slick or are difficult to

maneuver because of snow and ice. AS A HOMEOWNER, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE TO KEEP YOUR SIDEWALKS CLEARED. It might be a good idea to know if your neighbor needs help and shovel their walk as well.

SIDEWALKS AND THE 50/50 PROGRAM

The Fort Wayne cost sharing program for sidewalk repair is a great option for residents seeking to partner with the city in having improvements made to their neighborhood. Under this program, the city and the petitioning resident (or residents) will pay 50% of the cost of the repairs. Here's how it works:

STEP 1-Decide if you want to fix an individual sidewalk or an entire block.

STEP 2-Go to the city of Fort Wayne website to download and fill out a petition.

STEP 3-Submit the petition to the Board of Public Works Office for further processing.

After your petition has been submitted the Division of Public Works will provide a cost estimate of the sidewalk repair. If you wish to proceed, the project will be scheduled and the City will pay for 50% of the cost. In general, sidewalk repairs may cost about \$200 per sidewalk slab. In this case the homeowner would pay \$100/slab.
